- 14. important food source was the acorn, from which they made flour. Plants were also
- 15. used to make medicines.
- 16. The Chumash lived in villages that were connected by social, political and economic
- 17. ties. A typical village consisted of several domed houses, each with one or more
- 18. granaries, a ceremonial dance ground, a field for game playing, a burial ground; and
- 19. one or more sweat lodges. The Chumash were *enthusiastic* traders with other western
- 20. tribes, who bartered for Chumash hides, grains, fruit, beads, headdresses, nets, baskets,
