1. The Chumash people inhabited an area of southwestern California that included large
2. portions of present-day Los Angeles, Ventura, Santa Barbara, and San Luis Obispo
3. counties as well as the Channel Islands. They took advantage of the rich resources of
4. their homeland. They made great use of stone for milling and for making tools and
5. weapons. Their large domed huts were framed by willow poles covered with mats
6. made from twined bulrushes harvested from the marshlands. Plant fiber was also used
7. to weave baskets with beautiful, *intricate* patterns that are regarded as being among the
8. finest in the world. From the trees, they used wood to make bowls, bows, and several
9. types of canoes, the largest and most durable of which could hold up to twelve people
10. and ply the open ocean.
11. Although the Chumash were accomplished fishers and hunted a variety of animals,
12. including elk, antelope, deer, rabbits, and squirrels, at least three fourths of their diet
13. consisted of plant foods, including flowers, leaves, seeds, roots and bulbs. Their most
14. important food source was the acorn, from which they made flour. Plants were also
15. used to make medicines.
16. The Chumash lived in villages that were connected by social, political and economic
17. ties. A typical village consisted of several domed houses, each with one or more
18. granaries, a ceremonial dance ground, a field for game playing, a burial ground; and
19. one or more sweat lodges. The Chumash were *enthusiastic* traders with other western
20. tribes, who bartered for Chumash hides, grains, fruit, beads, headdresses, nets, baskets,
21. leather, tools, utensils, and canoes. The Chumash even had a currency represented by a
22. string of small white shell beads. At its height the Chumash nation consisted of 20.000
23. to 30.000 people, who inhabited 75 to 100 villages.
